Reminders to Candidates:

- Transfer credit requests must be approved by the program and submitted to the Graduate School before the semester in which a student defends/graduates. Transfer of credit requests that are submitted in the last semester **cannot** be listed on the Application to Candidacy and will not count toward graduation credits.
- To complete the Application for Candidacy form, print a copy of your unofficial transcript and refer to it as you complete the form. Please only include courses that count toward your degree. Do not include any failed classes or classes you were enrolled in that are not required/permitted for your degree. The number of credits indicated on the first page of the Application for Candidacy Form (confirmed by your program) should be the minimum number of credits that are required for graduation, not the total of number of credits you have earned.
